Job Description

Job title: Visitation Monitor

Provide assistance with safe exchanges and supervised visits for families.

- Assist in the safe exchange of children from custodial parent to non-custodial parent for scheduled/court ordered, overnight and weekend visits, and safe return exchanges
- Monitors visits between children and parents/family members ensuring a
 positive, safe environment; provides suggestions for a positive visit as
 appropriate; documents details of each visit per program procedure.

There is a chalkboard and a TV. The television is to make the room look like the living room at home. The chalkboard is painted on the wall.




Kids Room

There is no age limit when it comes to the visitation center. We have babies come in as young as 2 months old. The toys in here are meant for children between the ages of 6 months to 2 years.




Waiting Room

As soon as you enter you will have to sign in at the front desk. After you sign in you make a right and the waiting area is right there. You will need to sit there and wait for the visitation coordinator or monitor to come get you.



Front Desk

This is what you see as soon as you enter. After you enter you will make a left and go down that hall toward the visitation room.



Conference Room

The conference room is mainly used when doing intakes. It gives more space then the office does. It can also be used for our families to eat at a table like a family.



Back Entrance

For families who had a volatile relationship, there is a back entrance where you will never have to come in contact with the other parent.
